NURSERY

RECEPTION

We had detailed discussions about the different roles such as heroes/heroines and villains, settings and what the characteristics of a fairy tale and a traditional tale are.

As a Talk for writing school, we have been creating story maps and learnt different actions to go along with the stories each week. The children have been encouraged to innovate the stories by changing one or two characters and in this way create their own in small groups.

The children were able to use their creativity and imagination, while there were also developing their writing and team working skills.





YEAR 1
