


Mollie the School Dog



Hi, I am Mollie the School Dog.






A School Dog is a dog who lives with a teacher but comes to school to work with children and be part of the school family.

I live with Mrs Ward and will come to school on Wednesdays and Fridays.






I love going for walks, having strokes on my back and running around.

I will only be allowed to come to school if I am very well-behaved and always do what Mrs Ward tells me to do.




I will be on a lead when I move around school so you do not need to be worried that I will come too close. I will not be allowed to come to school if I jump up at people.
